Royal Vagabonds Foundation Awards 2018 Scholarships

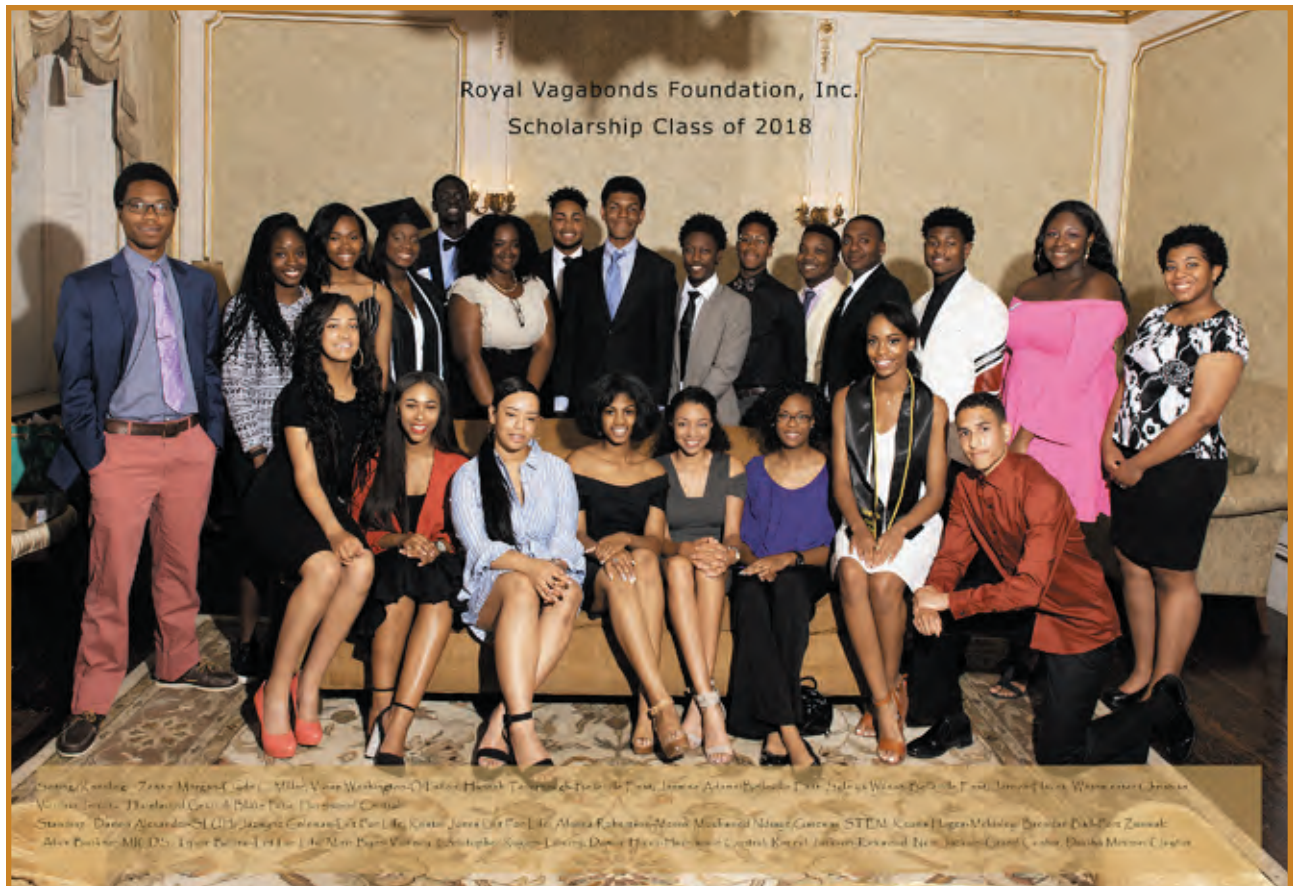




